NORWAY STUDENT WINS 3RD PLACE IN MONEY SMART WEEK POSTER CONTEST

FAIRFAX, IOWA – Janelle Morris, a sixth-grader attending Norway Elementary School, has won 3rd Prize in Community Bankers of Iowa's (CBI) Money Smart Week Poster Contest. As the 3rd Place finalist, Janelle will receive a \$300 Certificate of Deposit. Janelle's poster was submitted for judging by Fairfax State Savings Bank in Fairfax, Iowa.

CBI has been hosting the Money Smart Week Poster Contest since 1999, as part of the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago's Money Smart Week events (held this year April 23-30). To enter the Poster Contest, elementary students in 2nd through 6th grades submitted designs answering the question: "Why is it important to know about money?" The state-wide Poster Contest is sponsored at the local level by participating Iowa community banks, who submit the contest entries they receive to CBI for final judging. All poster submissions were evaluated based on overall message, creativity and workmanship. Janelle and the other two finalists beat out over 2,500 other poster entries received from schools all over Iowa.

"Janelle's poster design did a nice job of displaying reasons financial literacy is important, like home buying and saving for college tuition," said CBI Communications Director Krissy Lee. "Financial literacy for all lowa students is CBI's and Money Smart Week's mission, and what we hope they gain by entering the Poster Contest."

"We're very excited to have Janelle as a local winner for the contest this year", states Elaina Kempin, Assistant Vice President, Fairfax State Savings Bank. "Helping teach children to be smart about saving money is important to us as a local bank and an expectation as a good community partner."

The Grand Prize winning student receives a \$600 Certificate of Deposit, and 2nd and 3rd Place students each receive a \$300 Certificate of Deposit.
